Course Description

The Level 1 Award in Introduction to Health, Social Care and Children and Young People Settings provides an overview of how support services operate across care and educational environments. The qualification is intended for individuals who want to become familiar with the structure of the sector before considering roles that involve supporting adults, children, or young people.

During the course, learners examine how social care and children and young people settings are organised, including the services found within health care, social care, childcare, and early years provision. Furthermore, the qualification also outlines how these services respond to different support needs and the responsibilities professionals hold when maintaining safe and appropriate care environments.

The course also introduces the values that guide work across Social Care and Children's and Young People's services. Learners consider areas such as communication, safeguarding awareness, and person-centred support so they can begin to understand how professionals contribute to the wellbeing of individuals in health and social care children and young people environments.

Course Structure

Unit 1: Understand the Range of Service Provision and Roles within Health and Social Care, Adults and Children and Young People, Early Years and Childcare

Unit 2: Understand the Principles and Values in Health and Social Care, Adults and Children and Young People, Early Years and Childcare

Unit 3: Introduction to Communication in Health and Social Care, Adults and Children and Young People, Early Years and Childcare

Unit 4: Introductory Awareness of Person-Centered Support in Health, Social Care and Children's and Young People's Settings



Assessment

Assessment is based on written assignments. Learners complete assignments that explore communication, safeguarding awareness, and the principles used in social care and children and young people settings.

Duration

The Level 1 Award in Introduction to Health, Social Care and Children and Young People Settings is delivered through flexible online learning. It can be completed over a 2 – 3 months duration, depending on their availability and pace of study. Access to learning materials remains available for 12 months from enrolment.
